Assessments measure real-world skills that employers believe are critical to job success. Test questions are based on situations in the everyday work world.

The NCRC helps a job candidate:

- ♦ Demonstrate transferable employability skills
- ♦ Compare their work-readiness skill level to those required for jobs they want.
